PASTOR'S LETTER

Grace and Peace to you, my sisters and brothers in Christ!

Summer is winding down, and school is beginning, and with it our calendars will be full with activities. As you know, this congregation has been "in transition" for a while now, and my being new, the transition – while it's on its way out – continues a while longer. A couple of things will be a little different this year: the confirmation program is returning to a 2-year format, with confirmation being on Pentecost (in spring) for 8th graders. OK, so what will happen for our current 9th grade class? They will be confirmed October 25, on Reformation Sunday. Our Sunday school classes will run a little differently as well, being more rotational (activity-based) than grade-driven. Sunday school will begin with Rally Sunday, September 13. But instead of beginning at 9am, we will incorporate the Sunday school opening with worship. There will be ONE SERVICE that morning at 10:15, followed by an ALL-CHURCH PICNIC and MINISTRIES FAIR. (Don't worry, it's a night game that date!) And one more thing that will be different is the way we invite EVERYONE to participate in worship.

Sitting still for a long time is not easy for anyone, especially children. But if we don't encourage and train children to do this from an early age, they won't be able to accomplish it. So...this year we want to invite EVERYONE to join us for worship – even the babies! Our goal is to have all the families together for the opening part of worship, and after the Children's Message, the smaller children (age 5 and under) will be escorted to the fellowship hall for a special "Children's Time." They will have a Bible story and an activity while the grown-ups get to listen to the readings and the sermon. During the offering, the children will be escorted back into the sanctuary, so that they can participate in a blessing at communion.

There might be a few who are concerned about this – perhaps the children will be noisy or disruptive. But I assure you, even if that is the case at first, once the children learn how to be in

worship with everyone, they will learn to love worship, they will learn the prayers and the liturgy, and the desire for prayer and praise will grow in their little hearts. I ask for your cooperation in this – PLEASE try it. Don't be tempted to drop your children in the nursery; they need to be with us. And PLEASE be patient. Change takes time.

We will also be inviting the 3rd and 4th grade students to lead the congregation in the reading of the psalm, so everyone will be able to participate at an early age. Of course our 5th graders will be making their first communion on Reformation Sunday, and will join in the rotation to be acolytes. The confirmation students will help them, and will also be learning to be lectors (readers), ushers, greeters, and assisting ministers. You see? We ALL will be able to participate in worshipping God, learning about our traditions, serving in the community, and being covered by prayer.

God has blessed us with children. In the service for baptism, WE as a community made promises to help bring them up in the ways of this church. Now we get the chance to do just that. Pray for the children as they begin a new school year, a new Sunday school year, and a new way of being a part of the Body of Christ. AMEN!

Communications Update!!!

As we are still making the transition into a new school year, we are pleased to announce the creation of a new position: VOLUNTEER COORDINATOR. This position will be the point person for all activities that are staffed by volunteers. Assisting ministers, lectors (readers), ushers, greeters, acolytes, people staffing events, and all kinds of volunteer activities will be scheduled and arranged by the coordinator. Our first volunteer coordinator will be Jeanne Kolkoski, who will serve until December 31. She will call people to arrange schedules and calendars, including volunteers for work days, "office angels," and other workers. If you have any questions, please contact Jeanne or Pastor Anne.

You may be wondering about how this will impact Kathy Ferguson and the position of secretary. Kathy will be working SOLELY on membership. It is a requirement of each congregation that accurate records be kept, and archived every 5 years with the synod. This has not, to my knowledge, EVER been done. Our records are in very poor condition. This is a job that will take time and concentration, and should be done by a paid staff person, due to the confidential nature of the information. Volunteers will be asked to do all sorts of things, coordinated by Jeanne, so that Kathy's time and energies can be focused on getting our records in good shape. Please support our efforts by providing the office with any changes you have in contact information, vital statistics (births, deaths, transfers in or out, marriages, baptisms, etc). We expect this project will be completed in time for the February 15 Synod deadline.

This might look to some that we are dissolving the position of "secretary." That is not the case. However, in an effort to develop a job description and to better develop the budget for next year, we are de-constructing what the "secretary" position looks like. Once we determine exactly what our needs are, we can re-construct.

That leaves the question of the newsletter. Tom Ferguson will be helping me re-organize how we, as a congregation, communicate information, both internally and to the community at large. We are assessing the efficiency of all programs, and the newsletter is a part of that. To be better stewards of the resources with which we have been blessed, we will be revising the newsletter, and beginning in **October** we will be emailing to those who have email addresses, and handing out the newsletter in church the Sunday before and the Sunday after the first of every month. This will save on postage. Please note the bulletin boards throughout the church for information.

Change is hard, but often it is only in the midst of change that we can best see how ministry happens. We all are called to be stewards, masters of the resources through which God blesses us. Masters are responsible. I pray that we can see some of the ways in which change will strengthen God's Work in Our Hands, as we continue to plan for the future together.



A letter from our presiding bishop: August 21, 2009

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. -- Colossians 3:14-15

I write to you from the 2009 ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Minneapolis with official information about the actions of this assembly related to human sexuality. I am grateful for the manner in which this church has engaged in this conversation. The way this assembly has discussed these questions is a continuation of the way this church has deliberated: with deep and heartfelt respect for each other, engaging with Scripture, listening to the faith stories and experiences of one another, and through worship and prayer seeking the discernment of the Spirit.

In my response to the voting members on Friday, August 21, I made this request: we need one another. We need time. We need the voices of those who lament and those who rejoice over these actions, for together we have been called to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ and engage in God's mission for the life of the world.

The assembly adopted 676-338 -- precisely two-thirds of those voting -- "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust," the ELCA's 10th social statement, with minor editorial amendments. It also adopted a series of implementing resolutions with amendments. This theological and teaching document builds on the key Lutheran principles of justification by grace and Christian freedom to serve the neighbor. It emphasizes that central to our vocation, in relation to human sexuality, is the building and protection of trust in relationships. It therefore affirms that we are called to be trustworthy in our human sexuality and to build social institutions and practices where trust and trustworthy relationships can thrive. The social statement addresses marriage, same-gender relationships, families, protecting children, friendships, commitment, social responsibility and moral discernment. Regarding same-gender committed relationships, the social statement says that this church is not in agreement and recognizes the different perspectives which are present among us.

Our assembly also adopted resolutions proposed by the Church Council based on those contained in a "Report and Recommendation on Ministry Policies." The actions direct that changes be made to churchwide policy documents to make it possible for those in committed same-gender relationships to serve as rostered leaders in the ELCA. There were amendments to two of the proposals. The assembly adopted the resolutions in the following order, beginning with a strong statement about how we will live together in the face of our disagreements:

Resolution 3: "RESOLVED, that in the implementation of any resolutions on ministry policies, the ELCA commit itself to bear one another's burdens, love the neighbor, and respect the bound consciences of all." (Adopted 771-230 as amended)

Resolution 1: "RESOLVED, that the ELCA commit itself to finding ways to allow congregations that choose to do so to recognize, support and hold publicly accountable life-long, monogamous, same-gender relationships." (Adopted 619-402)

Resolution 2: "RESOLVED, that the ELCA commit itself to finding a way for people in such publicly accountable, lifelong, monogamous, same-gender relationships to serve as rostered leaders of this church." (Adopted 559-451)

Resolution 4: This resolution called upon members to respect the bound consciences of those with whom they disagree; declared intent to allow structured flexibility in decision-making about candidacy and the call process; eliminated the prohibition of rostered service by members in publicly accountable, lifelong, monogamous same-gender relationships; recognized and committed to respect the conviction of members who believe that the ELCA should not call or roster people in committed same-gender relationships; called for development of accountability guidelines; directed that amendments to ministry policy documents be drafted and approved; and stated that this church continue to trust congregations, bishops, synods and others responsible for determining who should be called into public ministry. (Adopted 667-307 as amended)

I invite you into important, thoughtful, prayerful conversation about what all of this means for our life in mission together. What is absolutely important for me is that we have this conversation together.

We meet one another finally -- not in our agreements or our disagreements -- but at the foot of the cross, where God is faithful, where Christ is present with us, and where, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we are one in Christ.

A letter from the Bishop of the Greater Milwaukee Synod, August 23, 2009

Dear Partners in Ministry,

"Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." Galatians 6:2

I greet you in the name of Christ from the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Minneapolis, where the voting members of the Greater Milwaukee Synod have served with grace and dedication, with worship and prayer, with considered attention to the business at hand, and with joy and imagination. We are grateful for your prayers that have accompanied us in our work, and for the interest that has been shown by those who have followed this Assembly on its web-cast. We are grateful as well for the prayers that will continue to support and encourage this church in the months ahead.

This week at its 2009 Churchwide Assembly the ELCA has asked itself, "What will be our witness?" and in response to this inquiry has committed itself to even more deeply bear one another's burdens, according to the instructions of the Apostle Paul. This commitment has taken many shapes over the past week, faithfully responding to the love God first showed to us in Christ. True to this faith, our time together has been centered in worship each day, constant in prayer, focused upon Scripture, and mindful of our life as the church in all its expressions, including globally and ecumenically.

We adopted an **HIV/AIDS Strategy**, which resonated with the stated priorities of our global companion churches in El Salvador and Tanzania in combatting the scourge of this pandemic, even as we are made aware of the pain it has inflicted within our own geography.

In solidarity with these same partners, and along with partners through Lutheran World Relief and the LCMS, we committed ourselves to bearing the burdens of those inflicted by malaria through the **Lutheran Malaria Initiative**, as we collectively seek to eradicate this disease.

"Bearing one another's burdens" takes the form of unifying the church, and breaking down the walls that have divided denominations from sharing the meal of grace, as we overwhelmingly voted to ratify a **full-communion agreement with the United Methodist Church**.

We recognized the burdens of our neighbors who are new arrivals to this country as we, with a strong majority adopted a resolution seeking **Comprehensive Immigration Reform**, and gave thanks for ministry of Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services, and Ralston Deffenbaugh, who has so capably led this work.

The 2009 ELCA Churchwide Assembly also adopted the Social Statement entitled, "**Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust**," and the subsequent **ministry policy decisions**. In the debate and in the decision to change ministry policy concerning the rostering of those who are in same monogamous, life-long, publicly accountable, same gender relationships, the themes of "loving one's neighbor" and "bearing one another's burdens" were cited as we recognize we are a church that is not of one mind on this subject. (I strongly encourage you to read the text of Presiding Bishop Mark Hanson's remarks following these votes at <http://www.elca.org/assembly> on the Web). The months ahead will be required to bring shape and focus to the particular implementation of this decision (the ELCA Church Council meets in November to consider this work), and even then the system for the rostering of our leaders and the extension of congregational calls will fundamentally be the same, with congregations finally determining whom to call as their pastor in a process guided by the Holy Spirit.

I am grateful for the spirit of communal discernment in our church, and at our Churchwide Assembly. Through it all we have come to recognize the deep love people have for this church, even as our views might vary as to how best live this out. This love was evident in the tears in the eyes of everyone in the Assembly hall upon the announcement of the critical votes. There were tears of joy and tears of sorrow. I found the tears in my own eyes to be a mixture of the two. As we "bear one another's burdens," let us do so in such a spirit, as a church united in witness to Christ, who himself wept, but who was raised from death to new life...for our sake.

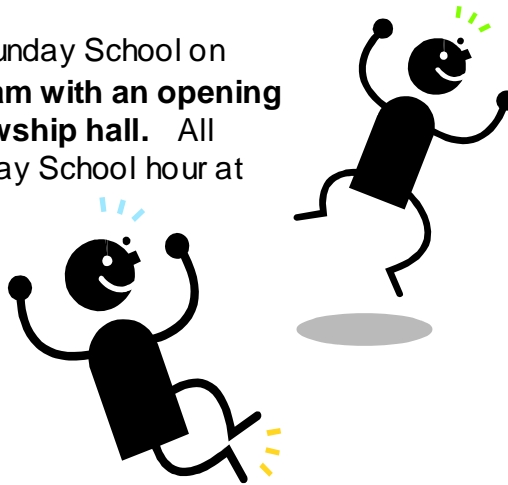

DEAR BETHEL FAMILY AND FRIENDS,

Sunday School begins on September 20. Tim Reichelt, our Sunday School team, and I have been preparing for a new Sunday School year. We're developing a **Sunday morning hour of learning activities that will help the family introduce their children to the Bible and to weaving faith into daily living.** We're trying something **new for the fall—a rotational style of teaching.** That means that the children will be moving to two centers: one where teachers introduce Bible Stories and another where teachers present application activities. The children also will have opportunities to learn about topics like Prayer and the Ten Commandments this fall. Throughout our time together we'll be helping the children apply what they are learning about God to their daily lives.

You can help us in these ways:

- Parents, bring your children to Sunday School on time. **We'll be starting at 9:00am with an opening for all the students in the fellowship hall.** All students also will finish our Sunday School hour at 9:50am with a closing in the fellowship hall. Feel free to come and enjoy this time with your children.
- Parents, reinforce what your children are learning. **Your child will be bringing home a hand out each Sunday** that outlines the Bible Story that we studied that morning, the Bible Point, and a Key Verse that connects with the theme of the lesson. There also are suggestions for discussion starters and activities to do at home throughout the week that keeps the growing going.
- Everyone, **pray for our Sunday School students and team**—that God would strengthen and develop faith as we study God's Word together.

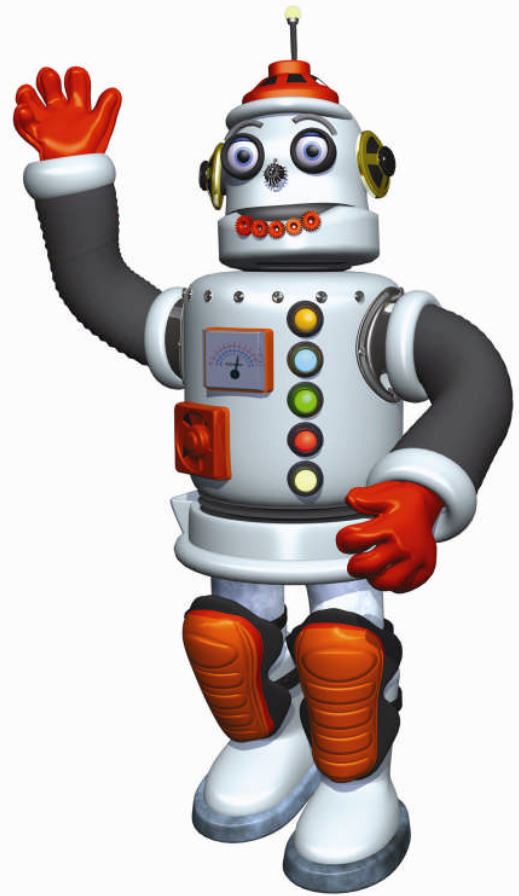
